Cpl Walter G Tunaley of the Norfolk Regiment was admitted to the 14th Stationary Hospital, Kantara, on December 26th suffering from gunshot wounds received in action whilst with the Forces in Palestine. He also fought in the battle of Gaza. Prior to enlisting Lce Cpl Tunaley was in the employ of Messrs J and H Girling at their Wymondham depot. He is a married man and is one of five soldier brothers, one of whom is reported missing and another wounded.
